

# Situational Analysis can be useful when...

## **The Context**

#### Internal

- ✓ What is happening within the organization?
- ✓ What do we need to nurture?
- ✓ What do we need to correct

#### External

- ✓ What is happening in the larger community in which we operate?
- ✓ What things are influencing us from the outside?

# **Internal Strengths**

- What do we do well
  - Experienced staff
  - Strong management
  - Good morale
  - Diverse programs for clients
  - Adequate technology



## **Internal Weaknesses**

What do we need to improve

- Salary structure
- Data collection & management
- Timely reporting
- Cultural diversity
- Staff training



# **External Opportunities**

- Opportunities that exist for us
  - -New funding announcement
  - -Access to rapid testing
  - -Supportive legislators
  - Positive linkages with community health providers

# **External Threats**

- Threats that may hinder us
  - -Cuts in services
  - -Influx of new club drugs
  - -Re-districting
  - -Increased unemployment
  - -Turf war with competing agency

Opportunities that are ignored can become threats. Threats that are dealt with can turn into opportunities.
