EG casino project delayed until 2021, says tribal chair

Wilton Rancheria Chairman Raymond “Chuckie” Hitchcock this week told the Citizen that the projected opening of the tribe’s proposed, \$500 million casino-resort in Elk Grove has been delayed until late 2021. If built, the project would become Sacramento County’s first tribal casino-resort. The project site is located on 35.9 acres at Highway 99 and Kammerer Road.

Tulare Co., tribe reach agreement on relocating Eagle Mountain Casino

The long push toward relocating Tulare County’s Eagle Mountain Casino received an added boost Tuesday when the Tulare County Board of Supervisors approved an agreement with the casino’s operating tribe, the Tule River Indian Tribe. The agreement spells out a variety of environmental impacts created by the casino’s move. As part of the pact, Tule River will wind up funding improvements on portions of Teapot Dome Avenue in Porterville along with the intersections of Avenue 256 and Spruce Road and Highway 190 and Rockford Road.
