The Estom Yumeka Maidu Tribe of Enterprise Rancheria opened their casino, the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino Sacramento at Fire Mountain. The facility features an 8-story hotel with 200-room hotel, six restaurants, meeting spaces and a fitness center. Gaming floor of 150,000 sq. ft casino hosting a selection of 57 gaming tables and over 1580 slots.
