

INDICATOR 4: Increase the percentage of newly diagnosed persons linked to HIV medical care within one month of their HIV diagnosis to at least 85%.



Craft Messages with Community Appeal

Raise Our Voices for Medical Care – The current recommendation is for people to engage in medical care immediately after a confirmed positive HIV test. When you wait a long time to get into care, it is more likely that the disease will progress to AIDS.
