Reasons Teens Use Tobacco, Alcohol or Other Drugs | Lists at 4 or more realistic reasons teens might choose to use drugs. | Lists 3 realistic reasons teens might choose to use drugs. | Lists 1 or 2 realistic reasons teens might choose to use drugs. | Does not list realistic reasons teens might choose to use drugs. |
| 3. Dangers of Experimenting with Tobacco, Alcohol or Other Drugs | Clearly explains why it's dangerous to try drugs and gives 1 or more examples. | Clearly explains why it's dangerous to try drugs, but does not give an example. | States that it's dangerous to try drugs, and does not give an example. | Explanation is not realistic and does not give an example. |
| 4. Negative Consequences of Drug Addiction | Correctly describes 3 or more negative consequences of drug addiction. | Correctly describes 2 negative consequences of drug addiction. | Correctly describes 1 negative consequence of drug addiction. | Negative consequences of drug addiction described are incorrect. |

Scale: **4** = Exceeds expectations **3** = Meets expectations **2** = Mostly meets expectations **1** = Does not meet expectations
